FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

The proposed legislation would allow a prosecutor to dismiss criminal charges against a person without seeking permission from the court. This dismissal would be without prejudice and could be filed again later. However, if it is filed after the time double jeopardy has attached, the dismissal would be with prejudice, unless the defendant has consented to having the case dismissed without prejudice. Double jeopardy would attach at the time a jury is impaneled or, when there is no jury, when the judge begins hearing evidence.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
