FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Revenue, Office of State Courts Administrator** and **Missouri Highway Patrol** assume no fiscal impact to their agency.

Officials from the **Department of Insurance** assume some insurers may be required to file new underwriting guidelines based on this proposal. There are currently 292 licensed insurance companies that write private passenger auto insurance. Fee is \$50 per filing. $292 \times \$50 = \$14,600$. Estimated revenue would be a range from \$0 to \$14,600 depending on the number of companies who chose to write this type of coverage.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.


DESCRIPTION

This bill prohibits the Director of the Department of Revenue from suspending or revoking a license or assessing points against a license for any offense committed by a driver operating a vehicle other than a motor vehicle.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
