FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Department of Revenue, Office of State Courts Administrator and Missouri Highway Patrol assume no fiscal impact to their agency.

Officials from the **Department of Insurance** assume some insurers may be required to file new underwriting guidelines based on this proposal. There are currently 292 licensed insurance companies that write private passenger auto insurance. Fee is \$50 per filing. 292x\$50 =\$14,600. Estimated revenue would be a range from \$0 to \$14,600 depending on the number of companies who chose to write this type of coverage.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

DESCRIPTION

This bill prohibits the Director of the Department of Revenue from suspending or revoking a license or assessing points against a license for any offense committed by a driver operating a vehicle other than a motor vehicle.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
