FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal allows a person to take home an open bottle of wine from a restaurant. The wine must have been purchased with a meal; the person must retain the receipt for the meal; and the wine must be resealed before leaving the restaurant. The person would be exempt from any open container violation as long as the new seal on the wine bottle remained intact.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
