DESCRIPTION

This proposal would allow a cause of action for damages for firefighters, peace officers, or emergency medical personnel who suffer injury, disease, or death caused directly by another's reckless, malicious, or willful act or omission, while in the lawful discharge of his or her official duties. The proposed cause of action would not apply to the acts or omissions of employers or co-employees, as provided for under Missouri workers' compensation law, nor would this proposal in any other way alter or amend Missouri workers' compensation law.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
