FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

Small businesses that are licensed to serve alcoholic beverages would be prohibited from using alcoholic beverage vaporizers or sell alcoholic beverages for dispensation by means of an alcoholic beverage vaporizer as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal prohibits the use of alcohol beverage vaporizers at all licensed premises where alcoholic beverages are permitted to be served and prohibits the sale of alcoholic beverages for dispensation by means of an alcoholic beverage vaporizer.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
