FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

In response to previous version of this proposal (FN #1256-01/ Perfected HB 423), officials with the **Department of Transportation** (MoDOT) assumed that unless civic organizations or individual donors contribute funds for the fabrication and installation costs of the signs, MoDOT would be required to bear the costs to be paid from the Road Fund.

Oversight assumes that Missouri State Troopers' Association will pay for the appropriate signage for both highways designated by this proposal, resulting in no fiscal impact to MoDOT or other agencies.
