### **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume the proposal would increase the dollar limit in small claims cases from \$3,000 to \$5,000. This may shift some cases to small claims court from the associate circuit court. Filing and other fees are lower in small claims court, so there may be some loss of revenues. CTS has no way of estimating what those amounts might be. Because small claims cases can be filed pro se, they require more clerk time to assist those filing. There may also be an increase in the number of trials de novo filed. In sum, there may be increased costs to the judiciary, but CTS anticipates the cost would be under \$100,000.

### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business
