FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal would change the composition of the governing bodies of certain state institutions of higher education.

- The next appointment to the board of curators of the University of Missouri after August 28, 2005 would be a student curator, whose term of service would be two years or as long as the person maintains the status of a full-time student. The student curator would have the right to vote on any matter before the board. At the end of the student curator's term of service, the governor would appoint a current full-time student from the University of Missouri to serve as student curator. Any student curator appointed after August 29, 2009 would not have the right to vote, and upon a unanimous vote of the nonstudent curators, a given meeting could be closed to the nonvoting student curator.
- The next appointment to the board of governors of Missouri State University after August 28, 2005 would be a current full-time student of Missouri State University whose title would be student governor. The student governor's term of service would be two years or as long as the person maintains the status of a full-time student. The student governor would have the right to vote on any matter before the board. At the end of the student governor's term of service, the governor of Missouri would appoint a current full-time student from Missouri State University to serve as student governor. Any student governor appointed after August 29, 2009 would not have the right to vote.
- The next appointment to the board of governors of Missouri Southern State University after August 28, 2005 would be a current full-time student of Missouri Southern State University whose title would be student governor. The student governor's term of service would be two years or as long as the person maintains the status of a full-time student. The student governor would have the right to vote on any matter before the board. At the end of the student governor's term of service, the governor of Missouri would appoint a current full-time student from Southwest Missouri State University to serve as student governor. Any student governor appointed after August 29, 2009 would not have the right to vote.

DESCRIPTION (continued)

- The governing board of Missouri Western State University would consist of seven voting nonstudent members and a nonvoting student member.
- The next appointment to the governing board of Truman State University after August 28, 2005 would be a current full-time student, whose title would be student governor. The student governor's term of service would be two years, provided the person maintains the status of a full-time student. The student governor would have the right to vote on any matter before the board. At the end of the student governor's term of service, the governor of Missouri would appoint a current full-time student from Truman State University to serve as student governor. Any student governor appointed after August 29, 2009 would not have the right to vote, and upon a unanimous vote of the nonstudent governors, a given meeting could be closed to the student governor.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
