FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal would require labor organizations to establish separate, segregated fund for political activities, and make political expenditures only from such fund. The labor organization would be required to disclose, in clear and unambiguous language on the face of the solicitation, that contributions to the fund are voluntary and that the fund is a political fund and will be expended for political activities. Union dues could not be used for political activities, transferred to the fund or intermingled in any way with fund moneys, and the cost of administering the fund would be paid from fund contributions and not from union dues. A labor organization could use union dues to communicate directly with its own members about political candidates, ballot propositions, and other political issues. The proposal provides criminal penalties for violations, and would be effective in August of 2005 for any new contract or contract renewal after that date.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
