FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials with Missouri House of Representatives, Missouri Senate, and State Treasurer's Office assume this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agencies.

Officials with the **Department of Transportation (MoDOT)** assumes the process described in this legislation would supercede the current memorial highway-naming process, therefore creating a cost savings to MoDOT because it would no longer be responsible for the cost in materials for such signs. MoDOT is unable to determine an exact cost savings, but estimates it to be less than \$100,000.

Officials with the **Department of Revenue (DOR)** assume the current memorial highway program is administered by MoDOT. This proposal requires DOR to provide applications, collect application fees, coordinate approval/denial process with the joint committee on transportation oversight, establish a 'department of revenue memorial highway sign fund', construct and maintain highway signs.

In the first year of implementation, DOR estimates that the costs of this proposal will exceed the amount that would be generated through the \$400 construction fee and the \$1,000 maintenance fee applications. Therefore, appropriations would have to be requested from general revenue to

purchase equipment, hire personnel and erect the highway memorial signs since the department does not have a program consistent with the MoDOT memorial highways program. The first year of implementation costs could exceed \$100,000 because the department will either have to purchase equipment, construct and erect signs or contract private vendors to administer the program.

Oversight assumes that implementation costs would not exceed \$100,000.
