FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal changes the laws regarding watercraft. The proposal:

(1) Adds chemical urine tests to the list of tests that may be conducted to measure the blood

alcohol content of a person operating a watercraft;

(2) Increases from \$200 to \$500 the damage amount that requires the filing of an accident report;

and

(3) Prohibits the use of any device that, when activated, allows a vessel's muffler to exceed the

maximum decibel levels allowed by law.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not

require additional capital improvements or rental space.
