### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

This proposal could reduce potential liability to small businesses which provide service letters for current or former employees.

### **DESCRIPTION**

This proposal would amend employee dismissal and information sections. The proposal would provide an employer with immunity from civil liability for the contents of a service letter or for any consequences of such a letter, unless the employer provided the letter with knowledge that the letter contained false information. An employer could also respond in writing to a written request concerning a current or former employee from an agent of a prospective employer, or a law enforcement agency.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
