No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

This proposed legislation adds guidelines for the use of bicycles on streets and highways. It also clarifies the safety procedures for vehicles passing bicyclists or pedestrians and creates punishment for the violation of those restrictions. The definition of a "designated bicycle lane" is added, along with indications of when motor vehicles are allowed to use them.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
