FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials of the **Department of Natural Resources** and **Department of Revenue** assume no fiscal impact to their agency.

Secretary of State officials stated that Statewide newspaper publication of state statutes cost approximately \$1,289 per column inch based on estimates provided by the Missouri Press Service x 3 for multiple printings as required by the Constitution and state statues = \$3,867 per column inch. Estimate total number of inches for this amendment to be 5 inches, which includes title header and certification paragraph. $$3,867 \times 5$ inches = \$19,335. These costs are based on 2004 figures and are subject to change.

DESCRIPTION

This proposed constitutional amendment extends, upon voter approval, the parks and soils tax to 2016. The tax will be resubmitted every 10 years thereafter.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space. This proposal would not affect Total State Revenue.
