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#### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

Small wine manufacturers in the state could increase the hours of operation of their liquor by the drink retail establishments and also would be allowed to sell a limited amount of non-Missouri made wines as a result of this proposal.

### **DESCRIPTION**

This proposal extends the hours of operation for premises operated by wine manufacturers who sell liquor by the drink from between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and midnight to 6:00 a.m. and 1:30 a.m. on Monday through Saturday, and from 11:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. to 9:00 a.m. and midnight on Sunday. The amount of Missouri-produced wine which must be sold by persons obtaining certain liquor licenses if reduced from 100% to 75%.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
