FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

Currently, the counties of Douglas, Ozark, Webster, and Wright are members of the Upper White River Basin Watershed Improvement District.

This provides a system for those counties to opt out of the watershed improvement district by either the filing of a petition signed by at least 20% of the qualified voters of the county requesting exclusion or by the County Commission placing the question on the ballot and upon countywide voter approval at the next general election.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
