# **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education**, the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri State Highway Patrol**, the **Department of Corrections**, the **Department of Mental Health** and the **Department of Economic Development** assume this proposal would not fiscally impact their agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services (DOH)** state this proposal would not be expected to fiscally impact the operations of DOH. DOH states if an impact were to result, funds to support the program would be sought through the appropriations process.

Officials from the **Office of Attorney General** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal could be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the **Department of Social Services** did not respond to our fiscal note request.

**Oversight** assumes because of additional conditions added which shall be considered abuse, the number of abuse and neglect reports will increase and an increase of costs is likely. **Oversight** assumes costs will be unknown and could exceed \$100,000.

### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

#### DESCRIPTION

This proposal changes the definition of what constitutes child abuse. Signs of an abused or neglected child can be, but are not limited to, severe malnutrition, severe bruising, lacerations, burns, fractures, ligature marks, or severe welting that are not the result of a medical condition, or substantial evidence of sexual intercourse by an unmarried minor under the age of consent.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
