No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This proposed constitutional amendment requires, upon voter approval, impeachments to by tried by the Senate. If the Governor is to be tried, the Chief Justice of the Missouri Supreme Court will preside. No person will be convicted without a two-thirds vote by all senators present. Currently, impeachments are tried before the Missouri Supreme Court or a special commission of seven jurists selected by the Senate.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
