FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** and the **Department of Economic Development, Division of Workforce Development**, assume the proposal would have no impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations** assume the proposal as written would cause the loss of federal Department of Housing and Urban Development funding for the Missouri Commission on Human Rights because it eliminates the statutory protection against retaliation in housing and public accommodations situations. The department estimated annual losses of \$359,788.

Oversight assumes the loss of federal funding would only occur if legislative language unacceptable to the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development became effective and was not remedied adequately. Oversight also assumes any housing and public accommodations issues could be addressed through other statutory or regulatory provisions. Oversight has not included any fiscal impact for the loss of federal funding in this fiscal note.

This proposal would modify various provisions relating to unlawful discriminatory practices in employment. The proposal defines retaliation, and specifies the amount of damages that may be collected according to the number of employees at an organization.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
