FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

The proposal may impact small business cosmetologists involved in supervising apprentice cosmetologists.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal increases the minimum number of hours a manicure apprentice must complete in order to be licensed from 750 to 800. A person may apply to take the required licensing examination if the person is a graduate of a foreign cosmetology program if the Cosmetology Board, in its sole discretion, determines that the program has educational requirements which are substantially the same as the requirements for an educational establishment licensed by the Board.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
