FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator, Office of State Treasurer and Missouri Senate** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **Department of Economic Development - Division of Professional Registration (DED-PR)** state having reviewed the proposed legislation and having sought the conclusion of the appropriate board(s), they are of the opinion that the proposal, in its present form, has no impact on the DED-PR. However, it is hoped that over a period of time the costs will be reduced to allow the license fees to also be reduced.

Officials from the **Office of Attorney General (AGO)** state the proposal will reduce four sets of boards into two. The AGO assumes that because of the changes in this proposal, its staffing requirements would either stay the same or decrease over time. The AGO assumes that this proposal creates no fiscal impact.

Officials from the **Office of Secretary of State (SOS)** did not respond to our request for a statement of fiscal impact.

Oversight assumes if the SOS were to incur printing and distributing costs, the SOS could absorb the costs related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and

distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process. Any decisions to raise fees to defray costs would likely be made in subsequent fiscal years.

Officials from the **Office of the Governor** did not respond to our request for a statement of fiscal impact.

DESCRIPTION


This proposal dissolves and establishes certain boards and committees under the Division of Professional Registration. The State Board of Barber Examiners and State Board of Cosmetology are combined to become the State Board of Cosmetology and Barber Examiners. The State Committee for Professional Counselors and the State Committee of Marital and Family Therapists are combined to become the State Board of Counselors and Therapists.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
