FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal provides that if an insurance company pays a claim on a salvage vehicle and the insured is retaining ownership of the vehicle and the vehicle has sustained only cosmetic damage and reconstruction or rebuilding is not being made, the vehicle will not be subject to the State Highway Patrol's examination in order to obtain a title.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
