FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTIONS

Officials from the **Department of Conservation** assume the proposal would expand the species permitted to be taken by hand fishing and proposes to extend the permissible hand fishing season by 15 days and to additional waters beyond that which is currently legal under the Wildlife Code of Missouri. Conservation Commission funds could be negatively impacted through the defense of the Commission's ability to responsibly manage the fishery resources under its authority. The actual fiscal impact is unknown.

Oversight assumes that MDC could require a valid license for hand fishing, however, Oversight also assumes that only a minimal number of persons would choose this method of fishing. Therefore, Oversight has not included any fiscal impact to the Conservation Commission Fund.

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume this proposal would have no impact on the courts.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.


DESCRIPTION
