### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### ASSUMPTION

The **Joint Committee on Public Employee Retirement (JCPER)** has reviewed this proposal and has determined an actuarial study is not needed under the provisions of section 105.660, subdivision (5).

Officials from the **Missouri State Employees' Retirement System (MOSERS)** assume this proposal would allow a juvenile officer in a first class county who has been covered by MOSERS to receive creditable prior service for service rendered as a juvenile court employee in a single county circuit. As proposed, if the service was covered by a county retirement plan, the county retirement plan would be required to transfer to the state retirement plan an amount equal to the liability for the forfeited service determined as if the person were going to continue to be an active member of the county retirement plan, less the amount of any refunds of member contributions. Under present law, the only creditable prior service as a juvenile office may receive in MOSERS is for juvenile court employee service in a multi-county, circuit. This proposal would expand this provision to include single county circuits.

Officials from the County Employees' Retirement System and Local Government Employees' Retirement System assume no fiscal impact to their agency.

## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

## **DESCRIPTION**

This bill allows juvenile officers in single county circuits to receive creditable prior service in the Missouri State Employees' Retirement System (MOSERS) for service as a juvenile court employee prior to July 1, 1999, if the service is not credited in a county retirement plan.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
