AN ACT

To repeal section 50.530, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to county officials.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 50.530, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 50.530, to read as follows:

50.530. As used in sections 50.530 to 50.745:

2 (1) "Accounting officer" means county auditor in counties of [classes one and two] the
3 first and second classifications and the county clerks in counties of [classes three and four] the

4 third and fourth classifications;

5 (2) "Budget officer" means such person, as may, from time to time, be appointed by the 6 county commission of [class one] counties [except in class one counties with a population of less

7 than one hundred thousand inhabitants according to the official United States Census of 1970

8 the county auditor shall be the chief budget officer] of the first classification, except as

9 **otherwise provided in this section**, the presiding commissioner of the county commission in

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

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- 10 [class two] any county of the first classification with more than eighty-two thousand but
- 11 fewer than eighty-two thousand one hundred inhabitants, in any county of the first
- 12 classification with more than seventy-one thousand three hundred but fewer than seventy-
- 13 one thousand four hundred inhabitants, and in counties of the second classification, unless
- 14 the county commission designates the county clerk as budget officer, and the county clerk in
- 15 counties of [class three and four] the third and fourth classification.
