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	Whereas, congenital heart defects are the most frequently occurring birth defect
2	and the leading cause of birth defect related deaths worldwide; and
4	Whereas, more than one million families across America are facing the challenges
5 6	and hardships of raising children with congenital heart defects; and
7	Whereas, each year 40,000 babies are born with congenital heart defects in the
8 9	United States; and
10	Whereas, some congenital heart defects are not diagnosed until months or years
11 12	after birth; and
13	Whereas, undiagnosed congenital heart conditions cause many cases of sudden
14 15	cardiac death in young athletes; and
16	Whereas, despite these conditions, newborns and young athletes are not routinely
17 18	screened for congenital heart defects; and
19	Whereas, Congenital Heart Defect Awareness Day provides an opportunity for
20 21 22	families whose lives have been affected to celebrate life and to remember loved ones lost, to honor dedicated health professionals, and to meet others and know they are not alone; and

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provide the opportunity to share experience and information with the public and the media in order to raise public awareness about congenital heart defects:
Now, therefore, be it resolved that the members of the House of
Representatives of the Ninety-third General Assembly, First Regular Session, the Senate concurring therein, hereby recognize February 14, 2005, as Congenital Heart Defect Awareness
Day in Missouri.

Whereas, the establishment of Congenital Heart Defect Awareness Day will also
