AN ACT

To amend chapter 167, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to a model school wellness program.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 167, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 167.229, to read as follows:

167.229. 1. The department of health and senior services shall establish a "Model School Wellness Program", and any moneys appropriated by the general assembly for this program shall be used by selected school districts to establish school-based pilot programs

- 4 that focus on encouraging students to establish and maintain healthy lifestyles. These
- 5 programs shall include tobacco prevention education and the promotion of balanced 6 dietary patterns and physical activity to prevent becoming overweight or obese, and
- 7 discussion of serious and chronic modical conditions that are associated with boing
- 7 discussion of serious and chronic medical conditions that are associated with being 8 overweight. The content of these programs shall address state and national standards and
- 9 guidelines established by the No Child Left Behind Act, the Healthy People 2010 Leading
- 10 Health Indicators as complied by the National Center for Health Statistics, and the
- 11 Produce for Better Health Foundation's "5 A Day, The Color Way" program.
 - 2. School districts may apply for grants under this section. The department of health and senior services shall establish selection criterion and methods for distribution
- 14 of funds to school districts applying for such funds. The department shall promulgate
- 15 rules to implement the provisions of this section.

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

16 3. A school district that receives a grant under this section shall use the funds to 17 plan and implement the program in a diverse sampling of schools in each district. The programs shall address students' academic success as well as health concerns, and 19 encourage links between the school and home settings to promote active healthy lifestyles across the students' learning environments. The tobacco prevention initiative shall focus 20 21 on grades four and five to target students before they transition into middle grades. The 22 obesity prevention programs will cover sequential wellness education across grades 23 kindergarten through fifth grades. These programs shall:

- (a) Be multidisciplinary, addressing academic standards in language arts, math, and health;
 - (b) Provide multimedia resources that engage the students;
- (c) Be evidence-based showing successful implementation including positive changes in desired outcomes, such as changes in body mass index or attitudes towards tobacco use:
 - (d) Be able to be integrated in to the core classroom at the elementary level; and
- (e) Be sustainable and provide open web-based resources to teachers and students across Missouri.
- 4. Hands-on professional development opportunities shall be provided in local districts for the teachers who will be implementing the program. Ongoing support shall be provided to the teachers and schools during the pilot period.
- 5. Following the completion of the 2005-2006 school year, the department of health and senior services shall evaluate the effectiveness of the model school wellness program in increasing knowledge, changing body mass index, improving attitudes and behaviors of students related to nutrition, physical activity, or tobacco use.
- 6. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, RSMo, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536, RSMo, and, if applicable, section 536.028, RSMo. This section and chapter 536, RSMo, are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536, RSMo, to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2005, shall be invalid and void.
 - 7. Pursuant to section 23.253, RSMo, of the Missouri Sunset Act:
- 49 (1) The provisions of the new program authorized under section 161.665 shall automatically sunset six years after the effective date of section 161.665 unless reauthorized 50 by an act of the general assembly; and

52	(2) If such program is reauthorized, the program authorized under section 161.665
53	shall automatically sunset twelve years after the effective date of the reauthorization of
54	section 161.665; and

55 (3) Section 161.665 shall terminate on September first of the calendar year immediately following the calendar year in which the program authorized under section 161.665 is sunset.
