	Whereas, the implementation of a new funding formula for public schools will
2	require additional revenue to become a reality; and
4	Whereas, of the date of filing this House Concurrent Resolution, not all potential
5 6 7	revenue sources have been identified and none has been committed to the foundation formula and
8	Whereas, the revenue sources should be identified and revenues committed to the
9 10 11 12	formula to ensure that all school districts in the state will receive at least as much formula revenue, including line 14 "at-risk" moneys per student for the regular school year as they did in the hold-harmless school year under the new formula; and
13	Whereas, the phase-in of the formula over a period of four years while new
14 15 16 17	revenues are being committed to the formula through acts of the General Assembly that are no included in the foundation formula bill makes predicting the district-level effects of the phase-in difficult:
18	Now, therefore, be it resolved by the members of the House of
19 20 21 22 23	Representatives of the Ninety-third General Assembly, First Regular Session, the Senate concurring therein, that the General Assembly would be well advised not to proceed to actual implementation of a new funding formula for public schools until necessary new revenue is identified and committed; and

Be it further resolved that implementation of a new funding formula for public schools should not proceed until the revenues actually received from the new sources are H.C.R. 32 2
