Whereas, the incidents of autism continue to soar at an alarming rate. It is estimated that more the 1.5 million Americans live with some form of autism, including more 2 than 100,000 children served under the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act 3 4 (IDEA); and 5 Whereas, data collected for the Department of Education indicate that the number 6 of children ages 6 through 21 diagnosed with autism served under IDEA has increased by more 7 8 than 500% in the last decade; and 9 Whereas, the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education 10 11 recently identified 2,801 children between the ages of 3 and 21 as autistic, an increase of 850% 12 from the 294 children identified in 1991; and 13 Whereas, the increase in autism spectrum disorder's prevalence across the entire 14 United States is an urgent public health concern, with the frequency of autism spectrum disorders 15 now surpassing that of all types of cancer combined; and 16 17 Whereas, while autism is not a curable disorder, recent studies have shown that 18 early intervention can have dramatic results for children which allows them to enjoy a productive 19 20 and independent life; and 21 Whereas, because many insurance companies and government assistance does not 22 fully cover the costs of services associated with autism, many families are spending in excess of 23 \$40,000 to \$70,000 a year for services for their children; and 24

25 **Whereas**, during the month of April the autism community around the United 26 States will be involved in many activities to increase awareness of autism: 27
