AN ACT

To repeal section 43.060, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to Missouri state highway patrol.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 43.060, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 43.060, to read as follows:

43.060. 1. Patrolmen and radio personnel shall not be less than twenty-one years of age.

- 2 No person shall be appointed as superintendent or member of the patrol or as a member of the
- 3 radio personnel who has been convicted of a felony or any crime involving moral turpitude, or
- 4 against whom any indictment or information may then be pending charging the person with
- 5 having committed a crime, nor shall any person be appointed who is not of good character or
- 6 who is not a citizen of the United States and who at the time of appointment is not a citizen of
- 7 the state of Missouri; or who is not a graduate of an accredited four-year high school or in lieu
- 3 thereof has not obtained a certificate of equivalency from the state department of elementary and
- 9 secondary education or other source recognized by that department, or who does not possess
- 10 ordinary physical strength, and who is not able to pass the physical and mental examination that
- 11 the superintendent prescribes.
- 2. Except as provided in subsection 3 of this section, no member of the patrol shall hold
- 13 any other commission or office, elective or appointive, while a member of the patrol, except that

the superintendent may authorize specified members to accept federal commissions providing investigative and arrest authority to enforce federal statutes while working with or at the 15 direction of a federal law enforcement agency. No member of the patrol shall accept any other 16 17 employment, compensation, reward, or gift other than regular salary and expenses as herein 18 provided except with the written permission of the superintendent. No member of the patrol 19 shall perform any police duty connected with the conduct of any election, nor shall any member 20 of the patrol at any time or in any manner electioneer for or against any party ticket, or any 21 candidate for nomination or election to office on any party ticket, nor for or against any 22 proposition of any kind or nature to be voted upon at any election. All members of the patrol 23 may, when requested, transport ballots and provide any other assistance or protection to 24 the election authority, any employee of the election authority, any election judge, any 25 registration officer, or any canvasser as required by section 115.059, RSMo.

3. Members of the patrol shall be permitted to be candidates for and members or directors of the school board in any school district where they meet the requirements for that position as set forth in chapter 162, RSMo. Members of the patrol who become school board directors or members within the state shall be permitted to receive benefits or compensation for their service to the school board as provided by chapter 162, RSMo.
