AN ACT

To amend chapter 167, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to school nurses.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

- Section A. Chapter 167, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 167.630, to read as follows:
 - 167.630. 1. Each school board may authorize a school nurse licensed under chapter
- 2 335, RSMo, who is employed by the school district and for whom the board is responsible
- 3 for to maintain an adequate supply of prefilled auto syringes of epinephrine with fifteen
- 4 hundredths milligram or three-tenths milligram delivery at the school. The nurse shall
- 5 recommend to the school board the number of prefilled epinephrine auto syringes that the
- 6 school should maintain.
- 2. To obtain prefilled epinephrine auto syringes for a school district, a prescription written by a licensed physician, a physician's assistant, or nurse practitioner is required.

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

9 For such prescriptions, the school district shall be designated as the patient, the nurse's name shall be required, and the prescription shall be filled at a licensed pharmacy.

3. A school nurse shall have the discretion to use an epinephrine auto syringe on any student the school nurse believes is having a life threatening anaphylactic reaction based on the nurse's training in recognizing an acute episode of an anaphylactic reaction.

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
