#### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

This substitute authorizes the board of aldermen in any city of the fourth class with 1,000 or fewer inhabitants, may by ordinance, choose to elect aldermen at-large instead of using the method in subsection 1. The seats of the aldermen would be filled at-large as soon as the current terms expire. Each year thereafter, one-half of the board would stand for election at-large for a two year term.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
