FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Department of Public Safety – Missouri State Highway Patrol, Office of the State Public Defender, Boone County Sheriff's Department, City of Kansas City, Springfield Police Department, and the St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agencies.

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume the proposed legislation would have no fiscal impact on the courts.

Officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services** assume the proposal would not have a significant direct fiscal impact on county prosecutors, although it may lead to an increase in prosecutions and caseloads.

Officials from the **Department of Corrections (DOC)** cannot currently predict the number of new commitments which may result from the expansion of the offense(s) outlined in this proposal. An increase in commitments depends on the utilization by prosecutors and the actual sentences imposed by the court. Passage of this proposal may increase the probability of arrest and/or conviction for assault.

<u>ASSUMPTION</u> (continued)

If additional persons are sentenced to the custody of the DOC due to the provisions of this legislation, the DOC will incur a corresponding increase in operational cost either through incarceration (FY05 average of \$39.13 per inmate, per day or an annual cost of \$14,282 per inmate) or through supervision provided by the Board of Probation and Parole (FY03 average of \$3.15 per offender, per day or an annual cost of \$1,150 per offender).

The DOC is unable to determine the number of people who would be convicted under the provisions of this bill and, therefore, the number of additional inmate beds that may be required as a consequence of passage of this proposal. Estimated construction cost for one new medium to maximum-security inmate bed is \$55,000. Utilizing this per-bed cost provides for a conservative estimate by the DOC, as facility start-up costs are not included and entire facilities and/or housing units would have to be constructed to cover the cost of housing new commitments resulting from the cumulative effect of various new legislation, if adopted as statute.

In summary, supervision by the DOC through probation or incarceration would result in additional unknown costs to the department. Eight (8) persons would have to be incarcerated per fiscal year to exceed \$100,000 annually. Due to the narrow scope of this new crime and the fact that the potential exists that they could already be charged with a crime, DOC assumes the impact would be less than \$100,000 per year.

Officials from the Columbia Police Department, Greene County Sheriff's Office, Jackson County Sheriff's Office, and St. Louis County Police Department did not respond to Oversight's request for fiscal impact.
