FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

The proposed legislation changes the laws regarding orders of protection by making renewals valid from the expiration date of the previously issued full order of protection. The proposal also restricts the court to one renewal of a full protective order. Currently, the court is allowed to issue a full order of protection and, upon a hearing with good cause, renew it twice.


This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
