FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume the proposal would not fiscally impact the courts.

Officials from the **Office of the Attorney General** and the **Missouri Highway Patrol** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Revenue (DOR)** state the proposed legislation will require the Customer Assistance Bureau (CAB) to add a new alpha restriction code to be displayed on the driver license or non-driver license of those registered with the Highway Patrol as sex offenders. The Highway Patrol will be required to submit a listing of all registered sex offenders to the CAB.

DOR states the proposal will require minimal table/programming changes to the Missouri Driver License System (MODL), Central Driver Information System (CDLIS) and the Missouri Electronic Driver License System (MEDL- also known as Over-the-Counter - OTC). DOR assumes the cost of these changes can be absorbed with existing resources.

DOR assumes the Highway Patrol will send an electronic file of the registered sex offenders so the MODL system can be updated.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal requires the Department of Revenue to put a unique code or identifier on the driver's license of anyone who is required to register as a sex offender. The State Highway Patrol must provide the department with the name, address, and Social Security number of every registered sex offender and must update that information every three months.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
