ASSUMPTION

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This bill authorizes the governing bodies of New Madrid County and the cities of Sikeston and Miner to require by ordinance or order that any library fees paid to any library district of which the county or city is a part must be designated solely to libraries within that county or city. The ordinance or order would not become effective unless approved by a public vote.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
