#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

## **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Higher Education** (DHE) assume this proposal would require DHE to collect reports from the institutions and provide the collected information in the annual report. There may be a fiscal impact by adding these duties. In addition, adding a course requirement or test for graduation could have a negative fiscal impact on students, who have to pay for the courses or tests, and higher education institutions that must provide these courses and tests.

**Oversight** assumes the additional reporting requirements are minimal and could be absorbed with existing resources. If unexpected additional duties are imposed or if multiple proposals requiring additional duties are enacted, resources could be requested through the budget process.

Officials from **Central Missouri State University**, the **Moberly Area Community College**, and the **Metropolitan Community College** assume this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from the **University of Missouri** (UM) assume the proposal would not result in any additional costs to the University.

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#### ASSUMPTION (continued)

Officials from **Missouri State University** stated that this course is already required in their general education program, and that the proposal would result in a need for more classroom space.

**Oversight** assumes that students would substitute any one additional required class for other basic educational requirements, and that any additional cost to the institution could be absorbed with existing resources.

## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

#### DESCRIPTION

This proposal would require any candidate for an associate of arts degree or bachelor's degree from a Missouri public post-secondary educational institution to have achieved a passing grade in a three-hour course covering the provisions and principles of the Constitution of the United States and of the state of Missouri, or to have passed an examination on that subject matter.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
