FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** assume little to no impact on the department or local school districts. There may be some printing costs associated with modification of this language; however, the modifications would not prohibit the materials from including the latest medically factual information.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services (DOHSS)** state this proposal would not be expected to fiscal impact the operations of DOHSS. If a fiscal impact were to result, funds to support the program would be sought through the appropriations process

Officials from the **Poplar Bluff, Nixa, Francis Howell, Kansas City, Columbia,** and **Parkway School Districts** stated there would be no fiscal impact to their districts.

Officials from **Central Missouri State University** stated this proposal would not have fiscal impact on their role as sponsor of public charter schools.

A fiscal impact request was sent to the school districts of **St Louis, Maryville, Salisbury and others** who did not respond to a request for fiscal impact of the proposal.

Oversight assumes any minimal costs to DESE or the school districts can be absorbed with existing resources.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This proposed legislation revises existing requirements for presenting information in public schools relating to contraception and sexually transmitted diseases. Students must be informed that personally and medically relevant information concerning contraception, abortion, and pregnancy may be obtained from their family practitioner.

Course material shall now include information regarding benefits to individuals, families, and society of a lifelong monogamous marriage between a man and a woman. Course material will also present scientifically accurate information on the development of the unborn child from fertilization until birth.

Currently, curriculum materials must be made available for inspection prior to use. The proposal clarifies that the materials should be available one week before use and also requires that schools must make known the instructor's name and any affiliation with an entity involved with human sexuality instruction at least one week in advance. The parental notification and approval process of a child's participation is expanded. No entity providing abortion services is permitted to furnish materials or instruction. The proposal also clarifies that its provisions are applicable to charter schools.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
