FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Social Services** assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agency.

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume the proposed legislation would have no fiscal impact on the courts.

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** assume there would be no quantifiable cost to the state. However, assuming some students remained in school instead of dropping out, there could be additional costs.

Officials from Columbia Public Schools, Kansas City Public Schools, Mexico Public Schools, Nixa Public Schools, Parkway Public Schools, Sedalia School District, and St. Louis Public Schools did not respond to Oversight's request for fiscal impact.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

The proposed legislation states that the provisions regarding school enrollment shall apply to any parent, guardian, or other person having charge, control, or custody of a child between the ages of 15 and 18 if the child has not received a high school diploma or its equivalent and a court order has been issued as to the child.

The proposal allows a parent or legal guardian of a child at least 15 years of age and before the child turns 18 to petition the court to declare that the child remain a minor until he or she is 18 years old.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
