### **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the Office of the Attorney General, Office of the Governor, Missouri House of Representatives, and the Missouri Senate assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agencies.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State** – **Elections Division** assume that statewide newspaper publication of state statutes cost approximately \$1,752 per column inch based on estimate provided by the Missouri Press Service x 3 for multiple printings as required by the Constitution and state statute = \$5,256 per column inch. Estimate total number of inches for this amendment to be 10 inches, which includes title header and certification paragraph. \$5,256 x 10 inches = \$52,560.

If a special election is called for this purpose rather than being voted on at a general election, the cost of the special election has been estimated to be \$1.2 million based on the cost of the past two such elections.

#### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

This proposed constitutional amendment requires, upon voter approval, impeachments to by tried by the Senate. If the Governor is to be tried, the Chief Justice of the Missouri Supreme Court will preside. No person will be convicted without a two-thirds vote by all senators present. Currently, impeachments are tried before the Missouri Supreme Court or a special commission of seven jurists selected by the Senate.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
