FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Transportation** and the **Department of Public Safety** - **Office of the Director** assumed no fiscal impact to their respective agencies as a result of this proposed legislation.

Officials from the **Department of Elementary & Secondary Education (DESE)** do not have data specifically relating to students living less than one mile from school and being transported due to safety concerns.

Using the 2005-06 payment year transportation data, the minimum expense for all districts, whose square mileage is 15 miles or less, that are currently transporting students that live less than one mile from school to receive state transportation aid for these students and to remove any penalty that is being applied if they are exceeding the current 12% allowance would be \$420,121.48.

If all districts whose square miles are 15 or less would transport at least 12% (the current maximum allowance to be transported less than 1 mile from school without a penalty) of the eligible ridership and receive state transportation aid under this legislation the cost would be

approximately \$686.7 million. DESE assumes the proposed legislation doesn't set a maximum number of students who can be transported living less than one mile from school and assuming that all districts could prove all students have to cross a "major barrier that constitutes a safety problem", the cost of this legislation could be much higher than \$686.7 million. For fiscal note purposes only, **Oversight** assumes an unknown number of students could be transported as a result of this proposal and therefore assumes the upper range of cost to be unknown.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This bill allows certain geographically small school districts to provide transportation to students who live less than one mile from their assigned school and be reimbursed by the state if the district can demonstrate that the students must cross a major highway or face an unsafe traffic situation.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
