FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** assume the proposal would not fiscally impact the courts.

Officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services** state the proposal will not have a significant direct fiscal impact on county prosecutors, although it may lead to an increase in prosecutions/caseloads.

For the purpose of this proposed legislation, officials at the **Office of State Public Defender** (**SPD**) cannot assume that existing staff will provide competent, effective representation for any new cases arising where indigent persons are charged with the proposed new crime of failure to lower tinted windows.

Passage of bills increasing penalties on existing crimes, or creating new crimes, requires the State Public Defender System to further extend resources. While the number of new cases (or cases with increased penalties) may be too few or uncertain to request additional funding for this specific bill, the SPD will continue to request sufficient appropriations to provide competent and effective representation is all its cases.

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<u>ASSUMPTION</u> (continued)

Oversight assumes the SPD can absorb the additional caseload that may result from this proposal.

Officials from the **St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department** and the **Department of Public Safety - Director's Office** and **Missouri Highway Patrol** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Kansas City Police Department** and the **Columbia Police Department** did not respond to Oversight's request for fiscal impact.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

DESCRIPTION

This proposal makes it a class C misdemeanor for a motor vehicle occupant to fail to fully lower any tinted windows upon the approach of a law enforcement officer.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
