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FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal changes the laws regarding health care liens. Currently, hospitals, physicians, and other health care providers whose services have been authorized in advance by the employer or insurer can give notice to the Division of Workers' Compensation in the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations for services provided for a work-related injury. The insurance carrier is allowed to pay the amount due secured by the health care provider's lien directly to the provider if the claimant authorizes it, does not challenge the amount of customary charges or that the treatment provided was for injuries caused by the tort-feasor and the amount is the customary charge.

The proposal also allows hospitals and clinics to have a lien on any person entitled to bring a wrongful death action. Such liens are limited to the recovery of medical expenses incurred for the treatment and injuries of the decedent in an amount equal to the portion of the provider's medical expenses not satisfied from the decedent's estate.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
