ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Higher Education** and **Missouri State University** assume this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **University of Missouri** assume this proposal would not impose any additional costs on their organization.

Although they did not respond to our request for information, officials from **Truman State University** assumed that a similar proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organization.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal would require that one voting member of the governing boards of certain state institutions of higher education be a student.

- The next appointment after August 28, 2006 to the Board of Curators of the University of Missouri would be a current full-time student, whose title would be Student Curator, and whose term of service would be two years provided that person maintains the status of a full-time student. The Student Curator would have the right to vote on any matter before the board. At the end of the Student Curator's term of service, the governor would appoint a current full-time student from the University of Missouri to serve as Student Curator.
- The next appointment after August 28, 2006 to the Board of Governors of Missouri State University would be a current full-time student of Missouri State University, whose title would be Student Governor and whose term of service would be two years provided the person maintains the status of full-time student. The Student Governor would have the right to vote on any matter before the board. At the end of the Student Governor's term of service the governor would appoint a current full-time student from Missouri State University to serve as Student Governor.

DESCRIPTION (continued)

- The next appointment after August 28, 2006 to the governing board of Truman State University would be a current full-time student of Truman State University whose title would be Student Governor and whose term of service would be two years, provided that person maintains the status of a full-time student. The Student Governor would have the right to vote on any matter before the board. At the end of the Student Governor's term of service, the governor of Missouri would appoint a current full-time student from Truman State University to serve as Student Governor.
- No voting student board member could be appointed after August 28, 2010. After August 28, 2010, the governor would appoint a voting nonstudent member and a nonvoting student member to serve on the board of governors.


This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
