#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from the **Department of Economic Development - Division of Professional Registration** state having reviewed the proposed legislation and having sought the conclusion of the appropriate board(s), they are of the opinion the proposal, in its present form, has no fiscal impact on their organization.

## **DESCRIPTION**

Currently, the provisions allowing dental hygienists to provide services in a public health setting for children eligible for medical assistance under Chapter 208, RSMo, will expire on August 28, 2006. This proposal repeals the sunset provision.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
