### **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials of the **Office of State Court Administrator** assume there is no fiscal impact on the Courts.

Officials of the **Department of Public Safety - Directors Office** and the **Highway Patrol** each assume no fiscal impact on their respective agencies.

Officials of the **Office of Prosecution Services** assume this proposal would not have a significant direct fiscal impact on County Prosecutors.

Official of the **Office of State Public Defender (SPD)** did not respond to our request for fiscal impact. However, **Oversight** assumes the proposal would not fiscally impact the SPD.

Officials of the **Department of Corrections** state this proposed legislation increases the penalties for injuring emergency personnel engaged in official duties. The penalty provision component of the bill resulting in potential fiscal impact for the DOC, is for a class B felony and this bill expands to whom existing penalty provisions apply, as well.

#### <u>ASSUMPTION</u> (continued)

Currently, the DOC cannot predict the number of new commitments which may result from the creation and expansion of the offenses outlined in this proposal. An increase in commitments depends on the utilization by prosecutors and the actual sentences imposed by the court. Passage of this proposal may increase the probability of arrest and/or conviction for assault or manslaughter. Estimated construction cost for one new medium to maximum-security inmate bed is \$55,000. Utilizing this per-bed cost provides for a conservative estimate by the DOC, as facility start-up costs are not included and entire facilities and/or housing units would have to be constructed to cover the cost of housing new commitments resulting from the cumulative effect of various new legislation, if adopted as statute.

If additional persons are sentenced to the custody of the DOC due to the provisions of this legislation, the DOC will incur a corresponding increase in operational cost either through incarceration (FY05 average of \$39.13 per inmate, per day or an annual cost of \$14,282 per inmate) or through supervision provided by the Board of Probation and Parole (FY03 average of \$3.15 per offender, per day or an annual cost of \$1,150 per offender).

In summary, supervision by the DOC through probation or incarceration would result in additional unknown costs to the department. Eight (8) persons would have to be incarcerated per fiscal year to exceed \$100,000 annually. Due to the narrow scope of this new crime and the fact that the potential exists that they could already be charged with a crime, it is assumed the impact would be less than \$100,000 per year for the DOC.

#### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

This bill specifies that a person commits the crimes of involuntary manslaughter in the second degree and assault in the second degree if he or she fails to yield the right-of-way to an emergency vehicle and, in doing so, acts with criminal negligence to cause the death of any person authorized to operate an emergency vehicle, while in the performance of his or her official duties.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
