FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials of the **City of Springfield** issued statements concerning the pros and cons of this legislation. **Oversight** assumes any future annexations under this proposal by the City of Springfield, the city would realize savings from not having to provide fire services to the annexed area. **Oversight** will show an unknown savings to the City of Springfield.

Officials of the **Logan-Rogersville Fire Protection District** assume this proposal would allow them to retain their tax base and service area when land has been annexed by the City of Springfield. Currently when an area is annexed and the area annexed is within a fire protection district, the city provides fire protection services, and the fire protection district loses its tax base, however, it discontinues providing fire services to the area. Officials assume this proposal would stop the piecemeal reduction of their district area and the tax revenues loss from these annexations.

Oversight assumes this proposal would allow fire protection districts located in Greene County to continue to collect their tax and they would continue to provide services to the annexed areas. Oversight assumes no fiscal impact to fire protection districts in Greene County.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

This bill requires that when any city in Greene County annexes property within a fire protection district, the property must remain part of the fire protection district for taxation purposes and cannot be serviced by the city's fire department.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
