### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education** assumed no fiscal impact to their agency or to local school districts, but deferred to the Department of Health and Senior Services for a determination of fiscal impact.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services (DOHSS)** assume this proposed legislation would not be expected to fiscally impact the operations of DOHSS. If a fiscal impact were to result, funds to support the program would be sought through the appropriations process.

Having reviewed the proposed legislation and having sought the conclusion of the appropriate board(s), officials from the **Department of Economic Development - Division of Professional Registration** assume this proposal will have no fiscal impact to their division.

Officials from the **Parkway, Columbia, and Poplar Bluff School Districts** indicated there would be no significant fiscal impact on public schools.

Officials from the **Kansas City, Missouri Public School District** and the **Nixa School District** assume there could be costs associated with maintaining a supply of the prescription and cost of any additional insurance coverage that might be required. **Oversight** assumes costs would be minimal and could be absorbed with existing resources.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

This proposed legislation permits school nurses, upon authorization by the school board, to keep on hand and administer prefilled syringes of epinephrine in two dosage strengths. The nurse may administer the medication when, based on training, he or she believes a student is having an acute anaphylactic episode. The prescription must be written by a licensed physician listing the school district as the patient, as well as the nurse's name, and filled at a licensed pharmacy.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
