FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Revenue** and the **Department of Public Safety - Highway Patrol** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services** assume the proposal will not have a significant direct fiscal impact on county prosecutors.

Officials from the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** assume the proposal would not impact the courts.

Officials from the **Department of Corrections (DOC)** state this bill, if passed into law, makes it a crime to display or possess fictitious or altered licensed plates or tabs. Penalty provisions for violations, the component of the bill to have potential fiscal impact for DOC, is for a class A misdemeanor.

Currently, the DOC cannot predict the number of new commitments which may result from the creation of the offense(s) outlined in this proposal. An increase in commitments depends on the utilization by prosecutors and the actual sentences imposed by the court.

<u>ASSUMPTION</u> (continued)

If additional persons are sentenced to the custody of the DOC due to the provisions of this legislation, the DOC will incur a corresponding increase in operational cost through supervision provided by the Board of Probation and Parole (FY03 average of \$3.15 per offender, per day or an annual cost of \$1,150 per offender).

In summary, supervision by the DOC through probation or incarceration would result in some additional costs, but it is assumed the impact would be \$0 or a minimal amount that could be absorbed within existing resources.

Officials from the **Office of the State Public Defender (SPD)** did not respond to our request for fiscal impact. **Oversight** will assume the SPD will not be fiscally impacted by the proposal.

This proposal makes it a class A misdemeanor to display or possess a fictitious or altered license plate, temporary license plate, tab, or renewal tab.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
